The Referral Process

A formal referral is not required.

Parents/Carers can contact PLUS directly.

The Project Manager will explain more about the project and will answer any questions.

To access the Bank Project young people will require funding for the service. Young people and families can get in touch with the intake team at Stirling Council to request an assessment or they contact their social worker to ask about having PLUS included on their care plan.

Some young adults may find that they are not eligible for support. PLUS has very limited charitable funds which might be able to support young adults to attend for a short period of time.

Additional services can be purchased directly, please get in touch to find out more.

Young people who are already attending the PLUS Youth Project will be contacted by the Bank Project Manager at least 6 months before their 18th birthday in order to explain the transition process.
